

Sephuma joins local artists in celebrating Africa

Some of the best in African, South African and Cape Town talent will converge on one stage at the Embracing Africa, Embracing Cape Town concert on Saturday December 18 at the Cape Town Station Forecourt from 5pm till 11pm.

Judith Sephuma, Chad Saaman and The Rockets will be among the local acts that will perform at the paid-for event. The concert is organized by The One City, Many Cultures (1CMC) Project, incorporating the Cape Town Festival (CTF).

Led by the Embracing Africa campaign of the OCMC Project, the concert echoes the theme of reconciliation as celebrated on the Day of Reconciliation, observed on December 16 annually.

With offerings that span a diverse range of musical genres, including afro-pop, world music, jazz, RnB, urban-pop, hip hop and soul, the organizers have attempted to cater to as wide a musical audience as possible.

Jazz and afro-pop SAMA Award win-

ner Sephuma will be the headline act.

The concert will see the newly revamped Cape Town Station Forecourt transformed into an entertainment hub with a food court with a variety of traditional African and Cape Town dishes on offer; a beer garden as well as refreshment and merchandise stalls dotted around the venue. Gates open at 2.30pm and concertgoers are encouraged to arrive early to savour the full experience.

Concert tickets allow access to the after-party at 121 Castle; a two-storey venue situated walking distance from the concert.

Concert tickets cost R100 per adult; children aged 12 to 18 years pay R50, while children under 12 enter free.

From Cape Town with love

My experience of Cape Town has been like a tumultuous love affair. Some days I wake up expecting a day of sunshine and all I find are clouds, wind and often rain. Other days, I am surprised by the city's generosity and love.

Nonetheless, as all my Capetonian friends tell me, it is a city filled with immense beauty. I have experienced its nightlife, its city life, its beautiful beaches and its historical life.

Visiting The Cape of Good Hope aka Cape Point was a truly moving moment for me. I felt this wonderful connection to Cape Town and to the African Continent. It is the point where destinies change: cold Agulhas currents become warm Benguela ones and cultures in complete contrast could peacefully interact.

The view from the lighthouse is truly breathtaking and the familiar Cape Town wind is at its most treacherous. I found it especially so because I was in a dress. I'm pretty confident in my wind surfing talents on land when it comes to avoiding embarrassing Cape Town wind situations, but Cape Point is no joke.

Rather save yourself the drama and wear pants of some sort. It is a little chilly but worth the cold and the money. There is also a cafe and restaurant. The cafe's pizzas are all named after ships like Star Of Africa and SS Lusitania. They are 19cm and range from R31 to R46.

There is an ironically named funicular (tram-like cable car) called the "Flying Dutchman" to take you up the mountain or you can take the walk. There is also a further walk to the most powerful lighthouse in South Africa (the original lighthouse that is no longer functioning).

Once at the top, you can pose against a pole with street signs pointing to the diverse cities around our beautiful continent. Cape Point, after all, is known as the halfway point between the East and the West.

As the point falls within the Table Mountain Reserve area, there is an entrance fee of R80 for adults and R20 for children under the age of 12. Unfortunately, unlike our African counterparts, we do not offer special decreased rates to our citizens or fellow Africans and thus

we must all pay tourist prices.

Being at Cape Point was like the highest point in my geographical love affair with Cape Town: that point in the relationship where you know that no matter what happens after that moment, you will love each other until the end of time.

One of the information boards in the curio shop quotes South African historian G.M. Theal: "during the age of sea power, the Cape of Good Hope was 'the most commanding point on the surface of the Earth.'"

It is this powerful point that has allowed me a pleasant farewell to you all.

However, unlike a break up, this farewell will be short lived because of all that this city has to offer. I dedicate this article to the Cape filled with Hope.
