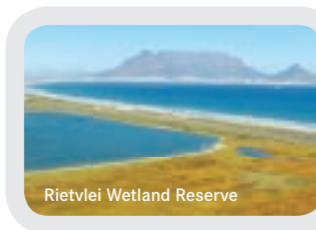

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WASTE & RECYCLING

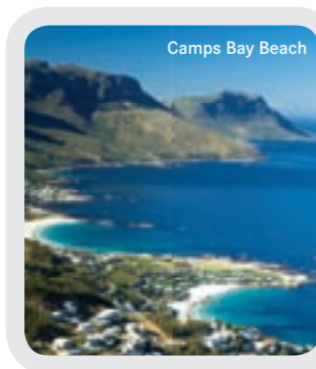
Waste minimisation is a key focus of the City of Cape Town. Drop-off facilities help citizens practice 'reduce, reuse and recycle' principles. All it takes is a new mindset - think twice. Separation at source is the key. Many City of Cape Town drop-off facilities accept the following waste items: Garden waste, motor oil, cans and metal, paper, cardboard, glass, plastic, builder's rubble, e-waste and polystyrene. Specific recyclables accepted vary per site.

CITY SHARK SPOTTERS PROGRAMME

- ▶ A GREEN flag means visibility for the spotters is good, and no sharks have been seen.
- ▶ A BLACK flag means visibility for the spotters is poor, but no sharks have been seen.
- ▶ A RED flag means a shark has been seen recently, but is no longer visible to the spotters.
- ▶ A WHITE flag with a BLACK SHARK, along with a loud siren, means a shark has been sighted, and bathers should leave the water immediately.

Important: No flag means that shark spotters are not on duty

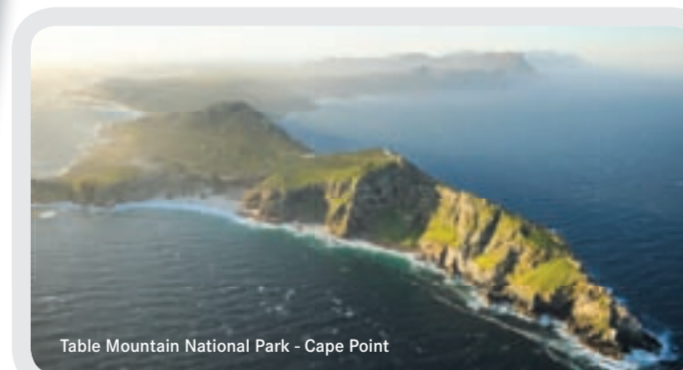

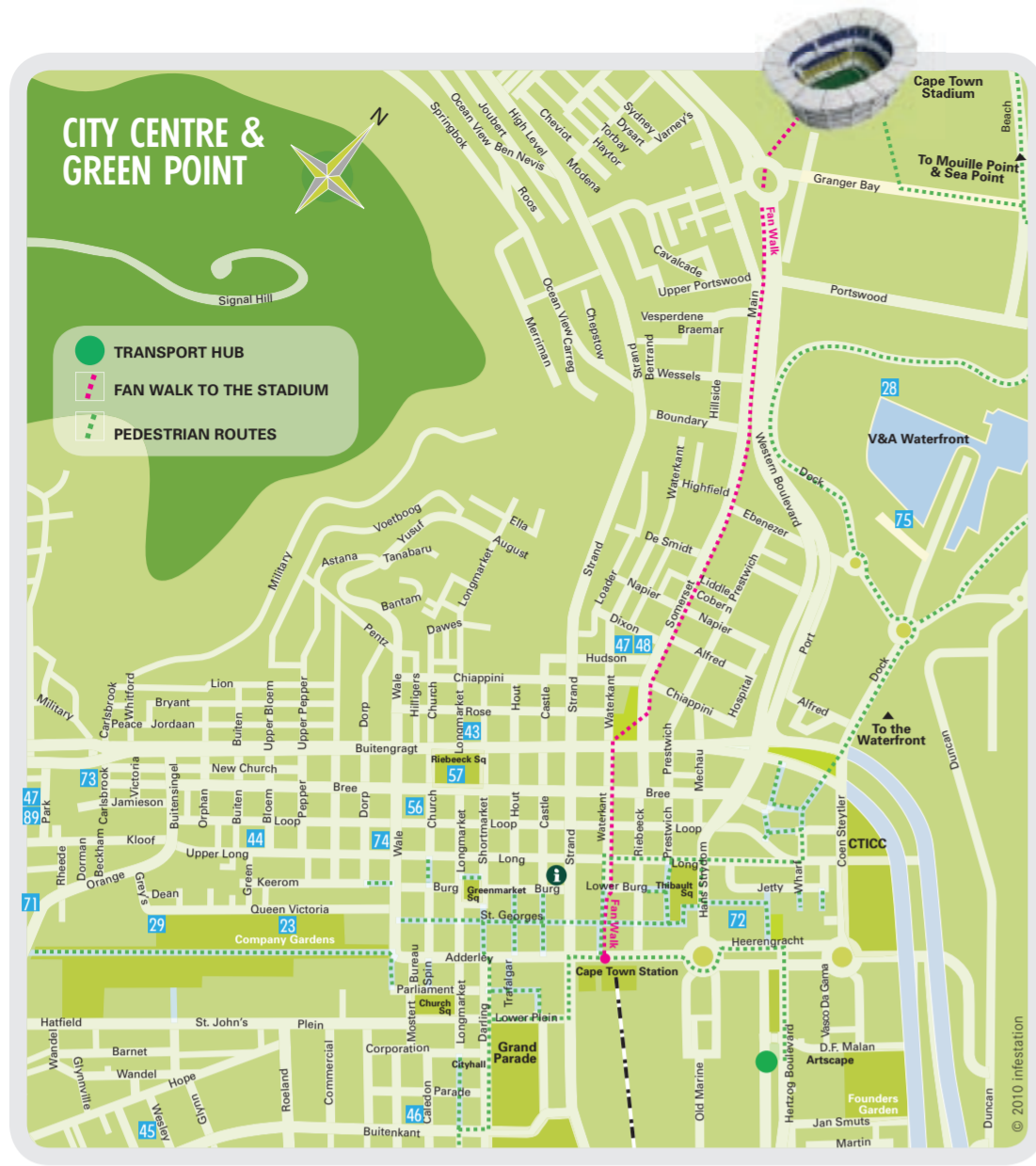
